## NGĀ TAKE O TE WĀ

### TE TAENGA ATU KI NGĀ KURA Ā IWI

Te Rāhui and I had the pleasure of visiting all our Kura which started with Te Kura Motuhake o Tawhiuau on 15 February and ended at Te Wharekura o Rakaumangamanga on 3 May. Thank you to all the Tumuaki, Kura and Whānau who looked after us and shared with us during our visits. Te Rāhui and I are amazed at the special effort and innovative initiatives that are happening in all our Kura and would like to acknowledge our Iwi, Hapū, Whānau, Poumarumarū, Tumuaki, Kaimahi and Uri for the amazing contributions that you all make.

The 'Pō Whakamānawa' at our National Conference on 3-4 August will be an opportunity for us to join to honour some of the incredible people who are doing amazing things in each of our Kura ā Iwi throughout the country. Our Board (Ringa Raupā) and Management (Ringa Wera) have set some kaupapa to enable our Kura to share more of what they are doing to inspire, support and grow the capacity of our Iwi, Kura and Whānau.

### NGĀ MAHI MŌ TE TAU 2018:

At the conclusion of this pānui is the 'Project Overview' for Ngā Kura ā Iwi for the 2018 financial year which ends on 31 March 2019. This overview shares with you all the projects that the Ringa Raupā and Ringa Wera are working on together with different members of Ngā Kura ā Iwi. These projects were set out in our 2018-2020 strategy as well as the Ngā Kura ā Iwi (NKAI) agreement with the Ministry of Education (MOE).

We are very thankful to all of you who are contributing to wānanga, to our conferences, to our development groups, to our projects in general, and especially to the Kura for the feedback, information and data that you give us to better inform us of how we are going as a kaupapa. This all helps us to identify opportunities to support our Kura and achieve Te Tihi o Angitu.

### **KUA EA: TE KIRIMANA KEI WAENGA I A NKAI ME MOE (Te Kāwanatanga)**

NKAI are due to submit another report to MOE this June as part of our agreement. The report will focus on the work programme that has been developed for 2018 and the outcomes that we are aiming to achieve. The Ringa Wera will be constructing the report on behalf of NKAI, and once MOE have thoroughly analysed the report, we will receive the next set amount of funding to support the next phase of our plans as set out in the Project Overview.

### **INFORMATION NEEDED FROM OUR NKAI KURA BY THE BEGINNING OF JUNE**

The most valuable information in the reports to MOE and to our NKAI network is the data and kōrero that we receive from our Kura. The purpose of the data is to help us see how we are going as a NKAI movement across the country. The narratives and good news stories that we receive from our Kura are very valuable, so that we can all be aware of and celebrate our Uri, our Kura including the Staff, and our Whānau. We include all the narratives that we receive into the NKAI report to celebrate what you are all doing and to share a snapshot of our Kura life from across our country. Whānau, for the upcoming report we will need information from you all and will send a request directly through to our Principals. For an indication of how this information fits into the bigger NKAI picture, please look at the Project Overview at the end of this pānui and take note of the areas that are written in red. The information that we will need from our Kura by the beginning of June is set out below:

- **Good News Stories: Year 1-8 Students.** Please send us a good news story about an event, achievement, attitude regarding the year 1-8 students in your Kura that has happened in 2017 or 2018. Please limit the kōrero to 2 paragraphs and it would be awesome if you could include some pictures that relate to the kaupapa.
- **Good News Stories: Year 9-13 students:** Please send us a good news story about an event, achievement, attitude regarding the year 9-13 students in your Kura that has happened in 2017 or 2018. Please limit the kōrero to 2 paragraphs and again, it would be awesome if you could include some pictures that relate to the kaupapa.
- **2017 Year 13 Graduates:** Please send through a short profile on a year 13 graduate from 2017. What are they doing now; What did they do at your Kura to prepare them for what they are doing now; and What does the graduate aim to do in the future. It would be awesome if you could also include a picture of the graduate with the profile.
- **Graduates who left your Kura five or more years ago:** This section aims to emphasise the value of our kaupapa by sharing what some of our graduates are doing five plus years after leaving your Kura. We ask that each Kura please complete a profile on 1-3 graduates who left more than five years ago. When did they leave School; What did they do after leaving school; and What are they doing now – Whānau, Marae, Iwi, Career.
- **Survey on where the 2017 graduates are in 2018:** This survey will help us to gauge where last year's graduating class have gone too. We will not be identifying individual schools in the report. However, we will be reporting on the data regarding the 2017 graduating cohort and where they have gone to. We ask that each Kura fill in the survey please, by the end of May.


## URI (STUDENT) LEARNING PROGRESSIONS

The full NKAI Board, Ngā Ringa Raupā met on 6 April. A key discussion point was our agreement (Kua Ea) with MOE where there is a focus on Ngā Whanaketanga achievement of our Uri in Pangarau and Te Reo Māori. Since the Labour government has come into office, there is no longer the requirement for all Schools to report against Ngā Whanaketanga or the National Standards. This has meant that many of our Kura still utilise Ngā Whanaketanga and some have chosen not to. This is reflected across the country now that Schools have a choice, since the new government has said that it is up to Schools how they report to government and their communities.

Although this is the situation, NKAI still want to monitor the progress of our students across the country and give support to our Kura where possible. This has led to Ringa Raupā deciding that we should undertake a new project which focuses on the learning progressions of NKAI students from years 1-10.

Therefore, NKAI has developed a new project to develop a system where we assess and monitor the progress of the learning of our rangatahi based on what we see as important as Kura ā Iwi. NKAI is organising a meeting for a group of Kura ā Iwi expert teachers to begin to develop this system and the goal is to have the system developed by the end of the year to measure the progress of our students in the areas that we see as important. This may include areas in Ngā Whanaketanga while also including areas beyond what is in Ngā Whanaketanga. The goal is that we will test the NKAI learning progressions system in 2019 that aims to assess the learning progress of our year 1-10 students in the areas that we as Ngā Kura ā Iwi see as important.

**REGISTRATION OF INTEREST** - A wānanga is planned for three days in week four, term two (21-23 May 2018) in Wellington. We are looking for the 'guns' in our Kura Tuatahi space who will and can commit three days to this important wānanga. ## NGĀ KAUPAPA MAHI MŌ NGĀ IWI, NGĀ POUMARUMARU, NGĀ TUMUAKI ME NGĀ KAIAKO

### NGĀ KURA Ā IWI LEADERSHIP WĀNANGA | 8-9 JUNE, Tūrangi

We are excited about the upcoming NKAI Leadership Wānanga in Tūrangi on 8-9 June. Please know that this hui is open to all people connected with Ngā Kura ā Iwi, but the numbers are limited. The focus is on leading our Kura and is especially relevant to Iwi, Boards, Tumuaki, School Senior Management teams and aspiring Principals. The focus on the Friday is on the Education strategy and initiatives of Ngāti Tūwharetoa. This will be an awesome opportunity for people to see how an Iwi plans for the development of its people and the initiatives that are set in place to enable this to happen.

On the Saturday, the wānanga will focus on Ngā Kura ā Iwi initiatives from around the country where our Iwi, Board, Kura and other experts will share in panels and workshops. Some of the panel discussions include;

- *Iwi Education Strategies Panel.* Large Iwi and smaller Iwi. Leaders from Tainui and Ngāti Manawa will share their Iwi Education strategies, while Wayne Ngata will share how MOE can support Iwi and Kura to achieve the aspirations of the Iwi for our tamariki.
- *Kura ā Iwi Inspirers Panel:* We will all have the opportunity to hear the views of some of our Kura ā Iwi whānau and why our kaupapa is the kaupapa for them, their Kura and their Iwi.
- *Kura ā Iwi Graduates Panel – Reflections and Recommendations:* Graduates from our Kura will share their journey, passions and aspirations with us. Our uri are the focus of our kaupapa and this is a time for some of our uri to share with us.

The Saturday workshops are;

- *How Iwi and Kura are Growing their Leaders for the Future.* Whānau from Te Wharekura o Ngāti Rongomai and Te Wharekura o Rakaumangamanga will share key points about their Kura and how they are growing the Iwi including our future leaders.
- *ERO Review and the Ngā Kura ā Iwi Methodology.* Come and learn what is involved in an ERO review where the NKAI methodology is used. Be ready for your next review.
- *Quality Appraisal Systems.* Come and see the most up to date strategies to appraise School Staff so it is valuable to them and the Kura.
- *Governance Models in Kura ā Iwi:* Kura will share how their Board works so you can consider these ideas for your own Board. The Kura that will be sharing are Te Whata Tau a Putauaki, Te Kura o Hīrangi me Te Kura Motuhake o Tawhiuau.
- *Te Arataki Kaimahi:* This workshop focuses on the support and management of staff with a focus on the collective employment agreements and competency.
- *First Time Principal Supports:* This session focuses on supporting our nine first time principals and will be supported by Evaluation Associates who lead Aotearoa's First Time Principals programme. This hui will be joined by some of our experienced Kura ā Iwi Principals.

### NGĀ KURA Ā IWI NATIONAL CONFERENCE | 3-4 August, Rotorua

Preparations for the National Kura ā Iwi Conference in Rotorua is well under way. We have a series of panel discussions and workshops being developed with a special focus on topics related to our Iwi, Boards, School Leaders and Teachers. The goal is that our people will be encouraged and inspired to take further action upon their return to their communities and Kura.

- *Workshops and Further Workshop Requests:* we are preparing a range of workshops, but also welcome ideas from our membership. If you have any ideas and think that several of our NKAI whānau would be interested in the workshop idea, please advise Watson and Te Rāhui via email.
- *Te Pō Whakamānawa.* On the evening of Friday 3 August there will be an evening where we will honour two people from each Kura for their contribution to the kaupapa of the Kura. This will be an evening to celebrate each Kura and the contributions of key people. The people will be nominated by the Kura and we will celebrate them all as Ngā Kura ā Iwi o Aotearoa. Please remember that only people registered at the conference will be able to attend this Pō Whakamānawa due to the limited space at the venue. It will be an amazing celebration of our kaupapa and each Kura.
- *Registration:* Just a reminder that it will cost \$100 per person to register and we expect that this will be paid by the Kura. The rest of the cost for the event will be covered by Ngā Kura ā Iwi o Aotearoa. One key contact person from each Kura is expected to coordinate the registrations of Staff, Board and Iwi members who will be coming to the conference.

### NGĀ KAUPAPA MAHI MŌ NGĀ URI

**NKAI CELEBRATION AT SECONDARY SCHOOL KAPA HAKA NATIONALS:** NKAI is setting up an opportunity for our participating kapa haka from our Kura ā Iwi to come together for an evening of whanaungatanga, kai and entertainment. This will be at the Massey University Student Center from 8pm to 11pm on Friday 6 July. Because of the numbers, this event will only be for the kapa haka students from our participating Kura ā Iwi kapa haka, their teachers and supervisors, and a selected group of students from Te Kura o Whakatipuranga Ruamano.

If your Kura is coming to compete at the nationals, can the lead teacher please contact Tineka via email to advise whether your Kura will be attending the NKAI Celebration and how many will be attending. Each Kura will be expected to bring your teachers and adult support team to this event to ensure that our students are supported, well supervised and everything goes well.

**YEAR 4-8 REGIONAL NKAI WHANAUNGATANGA SUPPORT:** The Ringa Raupā Executive Board will discuss the model to financially support Kura to have a whanaungatanga event for the Kura ā Iwi in your region. Please know that we do not have a lot of money, but we do want to support events financially that encourages whanaungatanga across our Kura. We will send out an update once approved by the full Ringa Raupā Board at the June meeting.

### INFRASTRUCTURE INVESTMENT

NKAI has adjusted our strategy regarding our IT infrastructure, so that more of our Kura and tamariki benefit. Please read below for further clarification and be informed, so that your Kura can take advantage of the opportunities.

#### **NKAI IT Academy**

The NKAI IT Academy was set up to help build Digital Technologies and Hangarau Matahiko programmes in Kura. Central to this, was providing students pathways into technology careers by gaining industry recognised certification.

The academy programme is based on the *Microsoft Learning Curriculum* and covers three key areas of learning - application proficiency, network administration and software development.

*Application proficiency* training is available now and focuses on participants becoming proficient in the use of Microsoft Office applications (e.g. Word, Excel and Power Point). After completing training and passing the relevant Microsoft exams, participants gain the Microsoft Office Specialist (MOS) certification. The academy programme is delivered as part of the NKAI Cloud Services Project.

### **KAIAKO – ‘TRAIN THE TRAINERS’**

After a review of the academy earlier in the year, the academy is focusing its efforts to train Kaiako who themselves will take the programme back to their Kura – i.e. ‘Train the Trainers’. Between now and the end of the year, Kaiako have an opportunity to gain Microsoft certification and be supported to deliver the programme in their own Kura.

**REGISTRATION OF INTEREST** - Places are limited to 30 people. Register your staff members as soon as possible with NKAI via email to Te Rāhui. Once you have registered a maximum of two staff members, you will receive course details of training wānanga and costs.

### **ADVOCACY & PARTNERSHIPS**

Advocacy is a major focus for Ngā Kura ā Iwi to ensure that our Kura are represented in any important discussion to do with our uri and Aotearoa's education, social and cultural landscape. Since the new government has taken office, there are many things being reviewed and many new initiatives being considered regarding the education of our tamariki throughout Aotearoa. NKAI will always endeavor to ensure that we are represented in these forums. In the project overview at the end of this pānui you will see the discussion groups that we are currently a part of and the key kaupapa that are being discussed.

### **HE KARAHIPi**

A second round for the 2018 Teach NZ Te Reo Māori (Secondary and Wharekura) Scholarships are now open and close on Monday 14 May 2018. There are 30 places available for students and graduates intending to undertake an approved Graduate Diploma of Secondary Teaching or a Masters starting in 2018. The scholarships are for people who want to teach te reo Māori as a subject in secondary schools (Te Tipu Whakarito); or for people who want to teach a secondary subject in Wharekura where te reo Māori is the language of instruction (Te Waka Whakarei). These scholarships will cover core study fees and pay an allowance of up to \$10,000 over the duration of the programme. We encourage you to share this information with people who may meet at least one of the following eligibility criteria:

- You have already started an approved Graduate Diploma of Secondary Teaching or Masters in the 2018 year.
- You applied for a Te Reo Māori (Secondary and Wharekura) Scholarship in the first round and missed out.
- You are starting a Graduate Diploma or Masters course mid-year in 2018.
